Long before this new law, Ontario’s Chartered Accountants were saying the same thing.

In the not-too-distant future, Ontario’s demand for skilled workers will vastly outstrip supply. We need more finance and accounting professionals, doctors, engineers, tradespeople, and we need them now.

The only way we can hope to meet this demand is to welcome already skilled professionals trained in other countries. The Ontario Government even passed a law to this effect, called the Fair Access to Regulated Professions Act.

Basically, it says “If a skilled worker from another country has the same qualifications, let’s recognize their training
